Words and usage:	<p>Reveal. This verb tells us that someone is giving information which hasn't been told before. Divulge and disclose, too, though these usually refer to private communication. Confess and admit have similar meaning, though the details may be negative in some way. For example, a crime or embarrassing event. An informal phrase often used to reveal gossip is to 'spill the beans (on an event)'.</p>
