


Title:	Paper mask	Level: lower
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Text:	<p>In the Wednesday lunchtime class, Shizuko told us about a TV programme she saw that had a feature about how to make a paper mask.</p> <p>You need three items; a piece of kitchen paper, a rubber band and a stapler.</p> <p>First, take the paper and fold it in half, then in half again, like a concertina.</p> <p>Put the rubber band around one end of the paper and staple it to the paper.</p> <p>Then do the same with the other end of the paper.</p> <p>Et voila, you have a mask!</p>
Discussion:	Do you think masks are useful or useless?
Words and usage:	<p>'Feature'</p> <p>This word means that something is included in, but is not the whole of something. It can be used for TV or radio programmes or a product feature. For example, 'the new car model features new technology'.</p>
