In discussion with a Thursday group last week, one student talked about her daughter-in-law who had given birth in April. The family was glad that it had happened after April 2nd, the start of the new school year, as being born just before the start is seen as a disadvantage in Japan. The reason for this is that a child born in March could be nearly one year younger than other children in the same grade. Imagine the difference an extra year's physical and mental growth could make at this age.

In Europe, the school year starts in September. Research by Cambridge Assessment, an exam board in the UK, has

shown that by the end of elementary school Autumn-born children are 12% ahead in development.

Being born in the summer can be a real handicap.


